3. Generate Documents

- o Will, trust(s), healthcare directives, powers of attorney.
- o Attorney created
- o One-page summary and video of documents, their purpose, and why they are important

4. Asset Alignment

- o Updating beneficiary designations, retitling assets, aligning accounts with the plan.
- o One-page summary of all accounts, assets, titles, and beneficiaries that need to be changed.
- o Beneficiary value add every other year

5. Catalog Legacy (Information Organization)

- o Document storage digitally through Dropbox
- o Nok List every other year
- o Personal letters (LEGACY letter package)
- o Recorded videos for your heirs
- o Funeral/Memorial wishes (template of items preferred: readings, music, pallbearers, ceremony style, etc.)
- o LEGACY manual (a beautifully bound manual with step-by-step instructions for what to do, who to call, where to find things)
- o Password list

o Digital scrapbook (A curation of personal stories, photos favorite family recipes, in a digital scrapbook format)

6. Yearly Review
